CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY POLICY

Preamble

The Company is already engaged in a number of community development and social service efforts as part of its corporate social responsibility initiatives. It is the vision of the Company to take up “education for the under-privileged and differently abled children” as the cornerstone theme of its future Corporate Social Responsibility.

Policy Statement

The Company’s CSR policy will focus on addressing the critical social, economic and educational needs of the marginalized under-privileged and differently abled children of the society. The policy will particularly direct its energies to orphan, homeless and differently abled children and care for their educational, nutritional, health and psychological development needs. The policy will also focus on sanitation including contribution to the Swachh Bharat Kosh set up by the Central Government for the promotion of sanitation, Contribution to Clean Ganga Fund set up by the Central Government for rejuvenation river Ganga and also contribution to the Prime Minister’s National Relief Fund.

Scope of CSR

All CSR projects will be over and above the normal course of the Company’s business and will be implemented through the Company personnel or external implementing agencies/ specialized NGOs jointly with the Company. The theme of “education for the under-privileged and differently abled children” is in consonance with clause (ii) of Schedule VII of the Companies Act 2013. This clause defines “promoting education, including special education and employment enhancing vocation skills especially among children, women, elderly and differently abled and livelihood enhancement projects” as permissible CSR activity. Sanitation and contribution to Swachh Bharat Kosh, Contribution to Clean Ganga Fund set up by the Central Government for rejuvenation river Ganga and contribution to the Prime Minister’s National Relief Fund are covered under Clauses (i), (iv) and (viii) of Schedule VII of the Companies Act, 2013.

Budget

A specific budget will be allocated for CSR activities. The amount will be approved by the Board on the recommendation of the CSR Committee.

Public Information

The Company's involvement in its CSR project and details of work executed and progress made will be communicated through its websites, annual reports, in-house journals and media.

Treatment of Surplus

It is specifically stated here that surplus, if any, arising out of CSR projects or programmes or activities shall not form part of the business profit of the Company and shall be redeployed in the projects.

Monitoring

The Company will set up a monitoring process for implementation of the CSR projects and periodic reporting to the CSR Committee in compliance with the requirement of Section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013.

Involvement

The Company expects participation of its employees in the CSR projects it undertakes. The projects are expected to create a strong bond between the community and the local set up where the Company runs its hotel. The Company would be actively involved in skill enhancement of boys and girls in hospitality business and opportunities could be provided to the deserving ones for employment in the Company.
